Board Chairperson, Mrs. Dougherty called to order the regular board meeting at the Carter County Health Center, June 24, 2024

MINUTES:

The board minutes were approved for the May 2024 meeting.

ACTIVITY REPORT:

The monthly activity report and department specific reports were presented for the month of May 2024.

BILLS:

Mrs. Cooper made a motion, second by Mrs. Murphy, to approve bills. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

CCHC AUDIT

Michelle Walker reported on the recent audit conducted by Pippin CPA. Although the final report has not been shared yet, Mr. Pippen expressed concerns regarding the interest earnings from the bank account and CD rates. He suggested that the Carter County Health Center could potentially increase their interest income by exploring other investment opportunities. Specifically, he recommended considering a money market sweep account, which would automatically invest excess funds while maintaining a minimum balance in the checking account. This could potentially yield higher returns compared to the current interest earnings. The board agreed to have Michelle Walker investigate these opportunities and present her findings at the next board meeting. Additionally, Mr. Pippen noted that the interest income should be higher given the amount of money in the bank, and he mentioned that while the audit did not uncover any major issues, there is room for improvement in investing the center's funds.

P&LSUMMARY

Mrs. Walker informed the board, of the YTD income and expenditures. She reported the YTD income was 49.23%% of what was projected, and the expenditures was 42.5% of that which was projected for 2024.

COLA-

Michelle Walker presented the topic of the annual cost-of-living increase (COLA) for employees. She provided a document outlining potential increases of 2%, 3%, and 4%, noting that the HR recommendation for a standard COLA is generally 3%. The board discussed the financial implications of these increases, with particular attention to the current economic conditions and the center's financial status.

There was a consensus that the cost of living has been rising, significantly impacting employees. The board reviewed historical practices, where COLA adjustments have typically been around 4%. Some members expressed a preference for maintaining this rate to ensure staff retention and morale, while also considering the center's financial health.

It was noted that implementing the COLA would involve adjusting the entire pay scale by the chosen percentage, affecting new hires and current employees alike. The discussion also covered the potential of implementing merit-based raises in addition to the COLA, but there was some concern about doing multiple raises within a year. Ultimately, the board leaned towards a 4% COLA to help employees cope with the increased cost of living, Mrs. Murphy made the motion and Mrs. Cooper seconded. CCHC will implement the 4% COLA into the current pay plan scale.



 - 1 car seat given
 - 6 car seat inspections
- Safe sleep- Available to qualifying WIC participants. We have a question added to our participant encounter form "Do you have a safe place for your baby to sleep? Y or N" If marked "no" we offer the safe sleep questionnaire. The form is then submitted to the state agency and they determine whether the participant qualifies for a Pack N Play. If a participant qualifies the SA will mail a Pack N Play to CCHC and can be picked up by the participant.


